

Supporting “Save Our Bridge” through eBay:

1. Buying an item on eBay:

During the checkout process, you have the option to make a donation (between \$1-\$25) to a charity of your choice such as Save Our Bridge Inc. At checkout, eBay will ask you to add a donation to your transaction. If you choose to give, eBay will automatically deduct your donation from your PayPal account and the PayPal Giving Fund will forward the donation to that charity. The donation is tax deductible and there are no extra fees for this service.

2. Selling on eBay:

If you are familiar with selling items on eBay, it is very easy to donate a portion of your sale to a chosen charity.

When you create your draft, check the box on your draft to donate a percentage of your sale to a charity of your choice. When you check the box,

When you check the box, eBay will ask you two questions: the charity you support and the percentage of the sale to donate to your charity (from 10%-100%).
